Research Activities

Research activities in the last three years have mainly focused on the relationship between processes of urbanization and consumption of resources with a special focus on the Swiss case. Parallel to this an other path of research has focused on the relationship between politics of labour and the city. Previously, while at the Berlage Institute and during his doctoral research, the main research focus has been the relationship between architecture and the project of the city, primarily analysed through the specific case of the capital city.

Professional Experience

He is the co-founder of the office Dogma. From the beginning of its activities, Dogma has worked on the relationship between architecture and the city by focusing mostly on urban design and large-scale projects. Dogma is also active in offering consultancies to municipalities and agencies concerned with urban planning and architectural issues. In 2006, Dogma has won the 1st Iakov Chernikhov Prize (Moscow) for the best emerging architectural practice and in 2013, on the occasion of the exhibition 'Dogma. 11 Projects' the first monograph on the work of the office was published by the AA Publications. The work of Dogma is part of the permanent collection at the FRAC Centre, Orleans (France) and at the Art Institute of Chicago (US) and has been widely published and exhibited. Among others, the work of Dogma has been published in *A+*, *ARCH+*, *AD*, *AA Files*, *Domus*, *Abitare*, *Project Russia*, *Perspecta*, *New Geographies*, *Over Holland*, *Log* and *Neutra*.
